COVID-19 Community Level Updated to High for New London County

Based on surveillance data available in a new tool created by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) called <u>COVID-19 Community Levels</u>, the municipalities within Ledge Light Health District are currently classified as <u>High</u>. Community Levels can be low, medium, or high and are determined by looking at hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID cases in a specific geographical area. CDC recommends taking precautions to protect yourself and others from COVID based on Community Levels in your area. All New London County residents are advised to:

- Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines
- Get tested if you have symptoms
- Wear a mask if you have symptoms, test positive, or were exposed to a positive case
- Wear a mask indoors in public, and on public transportation
- If you are at higher risk of severe illness consider taking additional precautions
